Most reports described women presenting in the third trimester with fever (68%) and coughing (34%). Lymphocytopenia (59%) with elevated C-reactive protein (70%) was observed and 91% were delivered by cesarean section. Three maternal ICU admissions were noted but no maternal deaths. One neonatal death and one intrauterine death were also reported.

	A retrospective study of women with COVID-19 who delivered during 1-20 march 2020 in Italy. 42 women with COVID-19 delivered. In 10 cases, indications for C-section were worsening dyspnoea or other COVID-19 related symptoms. Spontaneous preterm birth occurred in five cases. In two women with COVID-19 diagnosed in the post partum period and breastfed without mask, the new-borns had positive test for SARS-Cov-2 infection. In another case the new-born had a positive test after vaginal operative delivery.
